

## Space Tech Expo Europe – Proof of Vaccination or Negative COVID Test Result

### **ALL participants must be vaccinated, tested or recovered and provide proof before entering the building.**

The City of Bremen requires events to ask their attendees to provide proof of a vaccination, proof of recovery or a negative COVID test prior to entering the facility.

#### **Providing proof of vaccination**

A vaccination certificate or proof of recovery must be presented for entry. Vaccination must be with a vaccine approved by the European Medicines Agency (EMA).

The four following vaccines are licensed in the EU and in Germany:

- Comirnaty from **BioNTech** (Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine)
- Spikevax from **Moderna** (Covid-19 Vaccine Moderna)
- Vaxzevria from **AstraZeneca**
- **Janssen** from Johnson & Johnson

These vaccination or test certificates must already be provided upon entry into Germany.

**Verification of vaccination:** The following are acceptable as proof of Vaccination

- Original national Covid-19 Vaccination Record Card or EU Covid Vaccination certificate which includes name of person vaccinated, date of birth, type of vaccine provided, and date last dose administered (with at least 14 days passed since last dose).
- A photo or copy of a vaccination card as a separate document (The names of the vaccination or test certificate and the names of the registration are checked)
- A photo or screenshot of the client's vaccine card stored on a phone or electronic device. All information must be clearly legible

#### **Providing proof of Pre-Entry Testing**

Pre-entry testing is testing performed **prior to someone entering** an event, competition, congregate setting, or other venue or business which can reduce the risk of spreading infection for people who are entering these settings

- Testing must be conducted within **48 hours** before event start time for a PCR-polymerase chain reaction or **24 hours** for the Rapid Test. Results of the test must be available prior to entry into the event or venue

**Verification of negative test:** The following are acceptable as proof of a negative COVID-19 test result

- A printed document from the test provider or laboratory
- An electronic test result displayed on a phone or other device from the test provider or laboratory
- The information must include person's name, type of test performed, and negative test result
